

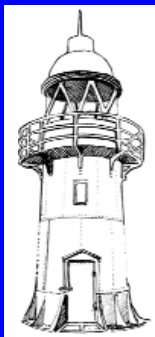

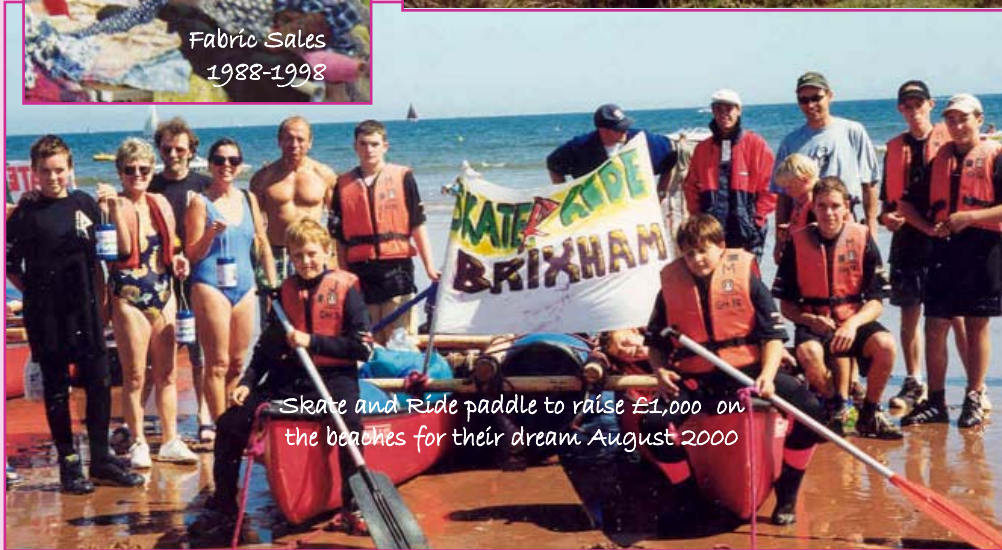

WHAT ACCESS TO COMMUNITY EDUCATION (ACE) OFFERS YOU

ACE supports physically disabled people, carers and volunteers by subsidising taxis, class fees, providing specialist equipment and employing Care Workers to attend all classes.

To maintain this programme the Trustees (**registered charity no. 1039623**) need to raise £60k per year. If you would like to help call **Maggie Dodd**, the Treasurer, on **01803 853848**.

To join ACE you pay **£5 annual membership** which entitles you to attend ACE courses. An initial assessment is required to ensure we meet your needs and that we can support you.

A taxi scheme is subsidised by ACE and users pay a charge according to the distance transported.

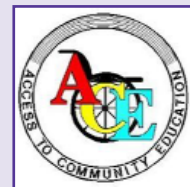
All facilities at the College are accessible for students with disabilities.

Large type or braille versions of learning materials are available for those with a visual impairment.

A portable hearing loop system is available for those who are hard of hearing. It can be used in any classroom to amplify the tutor's voice and reduce background noise, but you need to pre-book with Yvonne Ramos.

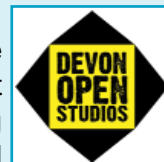

It is a legal requirement to have this qualification to operate a VHF radio fitted with Digital Selective Calling. It is vital to understand the correct procedures as unnecessary transmissions could block out a Mayday call. If you hold the 'old' VHF licence (pre-1999) you will need to upgrade your qualification if you purchase new equipment. *NB: Students should know the phonetic alphabet and bring a passport size photo plus £30 RYA Cert. fee.*



Sa3 RYA: First Aid with Tim Sunderland



Covers all aspects of first aid for anyone who goes afloat, whether on inland waters, rivers, estuaries or cross channel passages. In an emergency a little first aid knowledge can save lives.

Sa4 RYA: Radar with Tim Sunderland



If you have radar aboard your boat then you have a duty to use it for navigation and collision avoidance (IRPCS rule 19). This course ensures you are not misled because you do not understand its controls, its limitations, or interpret its picture incorrectly.

He is pleased with his progress in Maths though and has enjoyed the sessions.



Michelle Thomas: volunteering led to work.

Since returning to learn in 2009 Michelle has improved her computing skills and gained qualifications in Volunteering and Working with Children and Young People. She has also secured employment as a bank care worker with ACE. She told us "taking the first step was the worst but once you've done it then it's fine. I thought I couldn't spell but I surprised myself! I would advise anybody who knows deep down they want to improve to stop looking at the information, don't use excuses and just get on and do it."

Jolan Philpott: attending classes improved her health.

An ear infection left Jo with a lot of anxiety due to dizzy spells. This meant that it became difficult for her to go out and be in crowds or groups. Worried that she may develop something worse like agrophobia she committed to the 'Move On in English' class. This commitment gave her a focus and reason to get out of the house each week. Jo said "Meeting new people and working towards achieving something really boosted my confidence and helped me get better." Jo has since completed three courses and feels much happier in crowds. "Don't think about it, just give it a try. You'll be pleased you did".

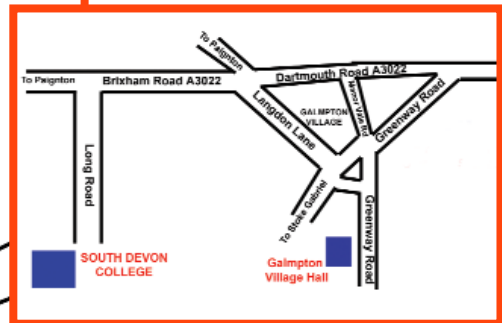
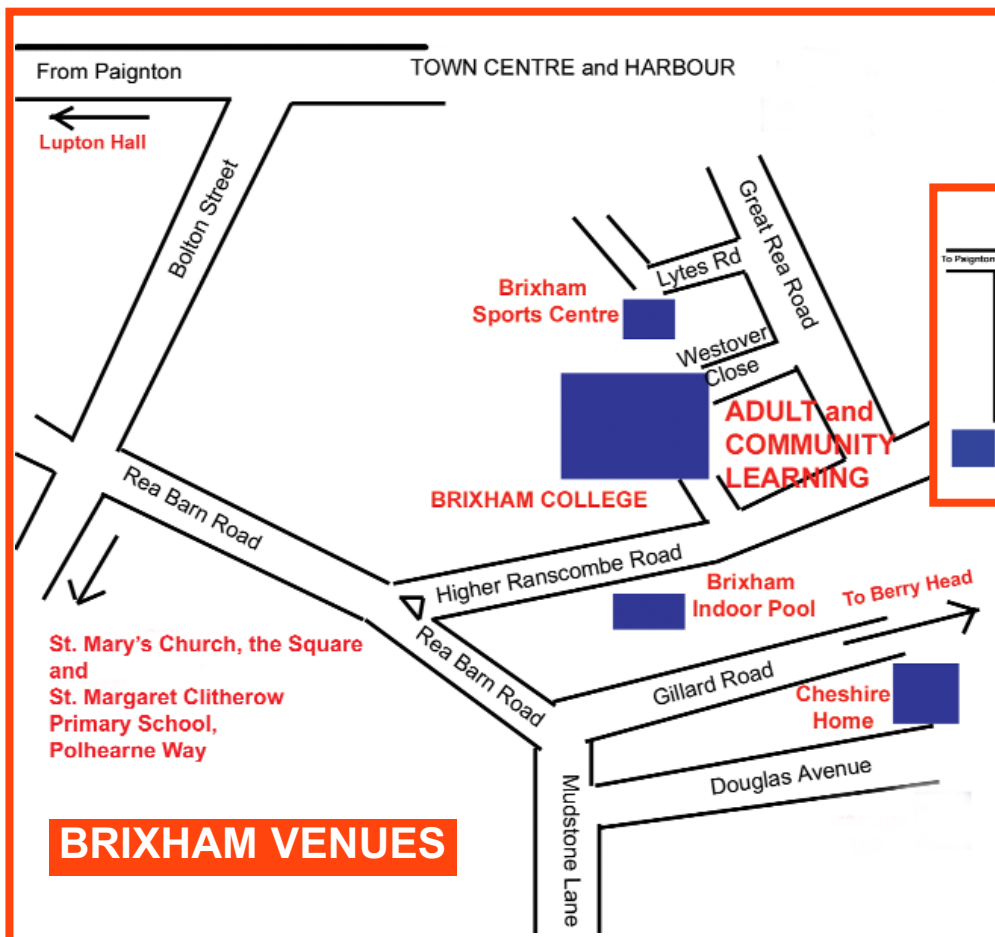

HOW TO FIND US

The Adult and Community Learning (ACL) Centre is situated at the Westover Close end of the College site offering dedicated space for adult learning throughout the day.

If you are attending a daytime class, or wish to pop in and see us, please walk into the College site via Westover Close which brings you to the ACL reception. **NB: There are only nine designated disabled car parking spaces available and you must display a blue badge to use one and sign in at reception.**

At night, for your initial class, come to the school reception desk where a member of staff will direct you to your room. Or follow the 'Adult Education' illuminated sign into the building, turn right, go through the walkway into ACL reception for help locating your classroom.

VENUES, REFRESHMENTS and SMOKING

Classes are held at Brixham College unless stated in the text. Other venues may have limited parking.

Hot drinks are available throughout the day for a small charge in the ACL Centre. If you prefer water please bring your own in a sports bottle. No drinks can be consumed in the ICT studio; please use the Community Room for breaks.

The Brixham College campus is designated as a smoke free zone. This includes the car park.

CAR PARKING

There are only designated disabled car park spaces during the daytime at the Adult and Community Learning Centre. Able bodied people are asked not to park on Westover Close where there is little space for manoeuvring, but to walk in to the centre. Plenty of car parking is available in the large school car parks at night. **The entrance to the main school campus, off Higher Ranscombe Road, is now adjacent to the Brixham Church of England Primary School, with the exit directly opposite Brixham College reception.** There is another large car park at the rear of the site on Lytes Road. Designated spaces are available for disabled users in all areas.

FEE REDUCTIONS/DISCOUNTS

Reduction Level 1 - Lifeguarding courses marked FE:

- 1) 100% fee and exam discount for students aged 16 -18 years on 31.08.11. Birth certificate must be provided at enrolment.
- 2) IQL courses are full cost to adults regardless of benefits.

Reduction Level 2 - on all courses 'NOT' marked FE:

- 3) 20% fee reductions are available for those receiving income based benefits. To qualify, original evidence must be provided when you enrol. A ready reckoner is provided on page 22 to help you calculate your discount.

Please note: There are no discounts available for one day courses.

HOW MUCH DO I HAVE TO PAY?

Course fees cover the services to support your study, tuition, premises costs and administration. The full fee is stated in the table of courses.

There is a charge for photocopied course notes where these are used extensively. Your tutor will inform you of the costs at the start of your course.

Examination or Accreditation Fees are the responsibility of the individual student and will be in addition to the course fee. These are payable at the start of your course and are only refundable if they have not already been paid to the exam board. Exam fees are printed in the specific class table.

Students aged 16-18 attending courses marked FE Youth are eligible for 100% discount on their course fees. Those attending the 'IQL National Pool Lifeguard' course are required to pay a learning deposit of £90. This is returned upon successful completion of the course.

Payment by instalments is possible if fees total £100+. Ask for details of our direct debit scheme.

REFUND POLICY

- 1) **If the course is cancelled by the College** every effort will be made to offer a suitable alternative or a full refund is available.
- 2) **If the student leaves the course** after the start date there will be no refund of payments made.
- 3) **A refund may be given due to a serious medical condition** (a medical certificate is required as evidence) but it will be in proportion to the time elapsed, less an administration fee.
- 4) **Students have up to 28 days to register a complaint** if they are not satisfied with the course. A full refund will be available if there is no satisfactory outcome.

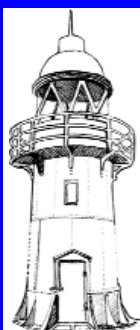
