SDHS Careers Programme Gatsby Benchmarks

South Devon High School has been working in partnership with Heart of the South West Careers Hub to embed and support the achievement of the eight Gatsby Benchmarks. We are currently 100% in benchmark 1,2,3,4,6,7,8, and 90% in Benchmark 5. We hope to achieve full accreditation by September 2021:

Benchmark 1: A Stable Careers Programme

•Every school and college should have an embedded programme of career education and guidance that is known and understood by Students, parents, teachers, governors and employers.

•Every Student and their parents should have access to good quality information about future study options and labour market opportunities. They will need the support of an informed adviser.

•Every Student should have multiple opportunities to learn from employers about work, employment and the skills that are valued in the workplace. This can be through a range of enrichment activities including visiting speakers, mentoring and enterprise schemes.

Benchmark 6: Experiences of Workplaces

•Every Student should have first-hand experience of the workplace through work visits, work shadowing, and/or work experience to help their exploration of career opportunities, and expand their networks.

Benchmark 7: Encounters with Further and Higher Education

•All Students should understand the full range of learning opportunities that are available to them. This includes both academic and vocational routes and learning in schools, colleges, universities and in the workplace.

Benchmark 8: Personal Guidance

•Every Student should have opportunities for guidance interviews with a careers adviser, who could be internal (a member of school staff) or external, provided they are trained to an appropriate level. These should be available whenever significant study or career choices are being made. They should be expected for all Students but should be timed to meet their individual needs.
