[A guide for parents and carers]

To report an absence your young person will use the SDConnect app

Good attendance is a key part of every student’s ability to succeed and reach their full potential while studying at South Devon College.

All courses have been designed so that students acquire knowledge, skills and behaviours in classroom or workshop environments, so attending their study programme is vital. Please note this may also incorporate English and maths.

There is lots of evidence to show the impact that positive attendance has on the achievement of grades, and the future opportunities this opens up for your young person. We would therefore ask you to encourage your young person to strive for 100% attendance during their time with us.

Students who fall below the College’s attendance target will be hugely disadvantaged, and as a responsible education provider, we will use our supportive intervention processes to address these behaviours where appropriate.

The College acknowledges that there may be times when a student cannot attend due to ill health, significant appointments, etc.

Absence must be reported through our SDConnect app. Where possible, this will be prior to the student’s first lesson of the day. A text message will be sent out daily to parents or carers of any student who is absent without a known reason.

It is the responsibility of the parent or carer to keep the College informed of any changes to their contact details, including change of address and up to date mobile telephone numbers.

Progress Portal

We are excited to introduce you to our new Progress Portal, which provides secure access to your young person’s attendance and progress information. After enrolment, as long as your young person consents, you will be sent an email with details on how to access your Progress Portal account.

Once you have access you will be able to see your young person’s timetable, attendance and reviews, get notifications if there are any concerns, and be able to contact their personal tutor directly through the portal.

Examples of reasons for absence

Illness	Unauthorised absence
Medical appointments	Unauthorised absence
All appointments should be booked on non-College days whenever possible, and appointment cards/letters should be provided	
Holiday	Unauthorised absence
Working	Unauthorised absence
Driving lesson	Unauthorised absence
Looking after siblings	Unauthorised absence

- ❑ Safeguarding – supporting behaviour and welfare of students
